Check your equipment-Make sure your home's smoke detectors are always in working order and that your fire extinguishers have not passed their expiration date and are easily accessible. Get drop-down window ladders if you have bedrooms above the first floor level.

Who to trust?-Children can get separated from their families at any time-a big public event, in a crowded store or mall, or on a family outing. Teach them to stay where they are and not to go wandering off to try to find you. Little ones should be taught to just have a seat on the ground and start calling out, as loud as they can, "Mommy" or "Daddy"- or whatever they call you. If children are separated from you for a long period of time, tell them they should inform a safe adult-a mother with children, a police officer, a store clerk or security guard.
